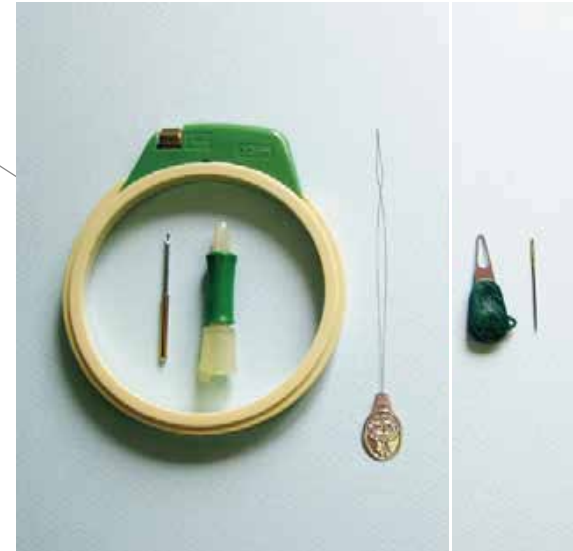


Book Cover with wool embroidery



The inner edge of the frame will firmly keep the cloth in place, so you can embroider without it relaxing.



Perfect for also wool embroidery, due to its large needle hole.

Set your embroidery stitching tool to the thickest setting before use.

Tools

- Embroidery Stitching Tool
- Embroidery Stitching Tool Needle Refill (Needle for Medium-Fine Yarn)
- Clover Embroidery Hoop (18 cm) or Clover Embroidery Hoop (12 cm)
- Gold Eye Tapestry Needles (No. 18, 20, 22)
- Clover Yarn Threader
- Glue
- Scissors
- Sewing tools

Materials

- Thread
- Medium thickness wool
- Cloth:
Plain weave cotton fabric is recommended.



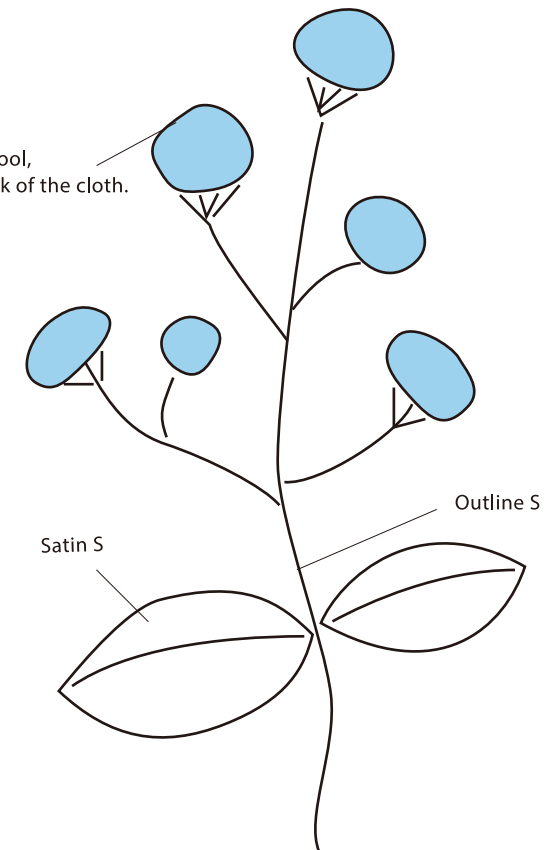
Book Cover with wool embroidery

Vervain

1. Copy the design onto the cloth.
2. Lightly trace the flower using an Erasable Marker onto the back of the cloth.
3. Embroider with a tapestry needle. Satin stitch leaves using green thread, along with the stems.
4. Start stitching, using the Embroidery Stitching Tool. Set the scale to 1.
5. Lightly coat stitched points with glue to prevent fraying.
6. Allow it to dry before using.



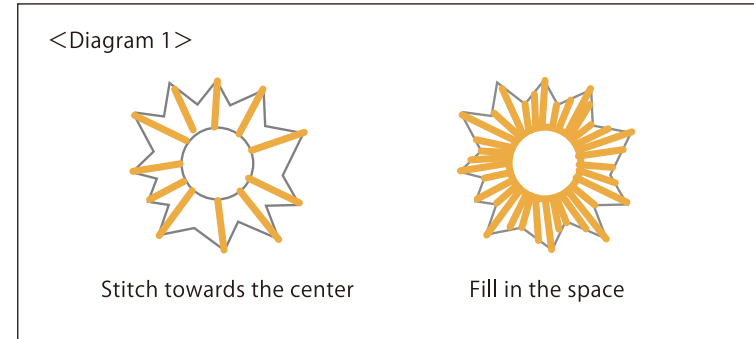
Using the Embroidery Stitching Tool,
begin embroidering from the back of the cloth.



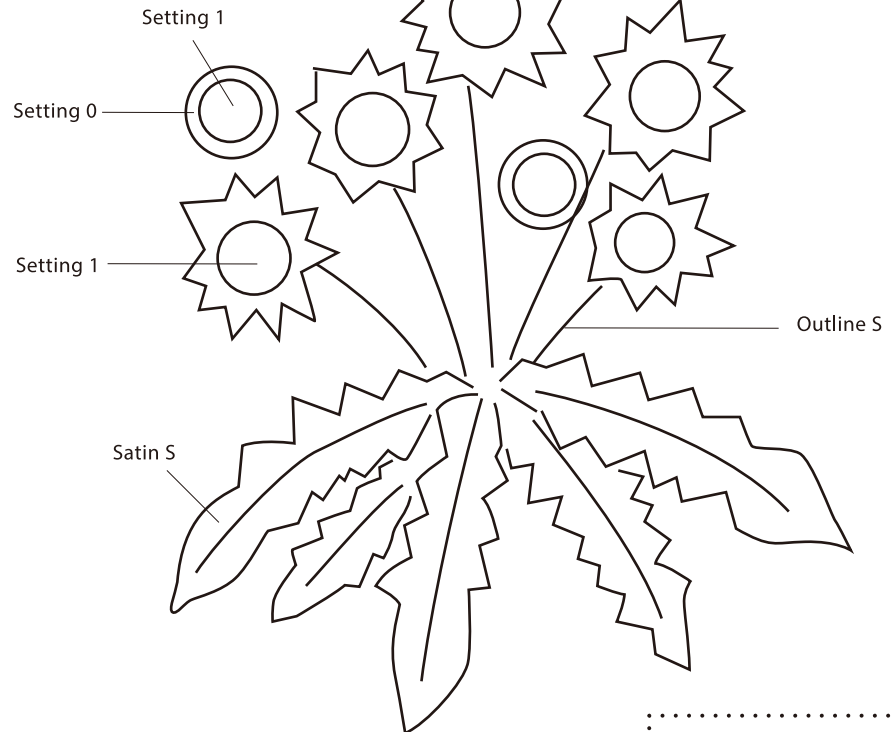
Book Cover with wool embroidery

Dandelion

1. Copy the design onto the cloth.
2. Lightly trace the flower using an Erasable Marker onto the back of the cloth.
If you are not tracing the design, you can use a Mesh Transfer Canvas (Art No.474), or simply copy the diagram freehand.
3. Embroider with a Tapestry Needle. Satin stitch leaves using green thread, along with the stems. Allow the center of the leaves to be left slightly empty.
4. Start stitching, using the Embroidery Stitching Tool. Set the scale to 1, Change the setting to 0, and continue with the outside portion of the dandelions. Return it to 1, and fill out the flowers' centers.
5. Lightly coat stitched points with glue to prevent fraying.
6. Allow it to dry before using.



Using the Embroidery Stitching Tool, begin embroidering from the back of the cloth.

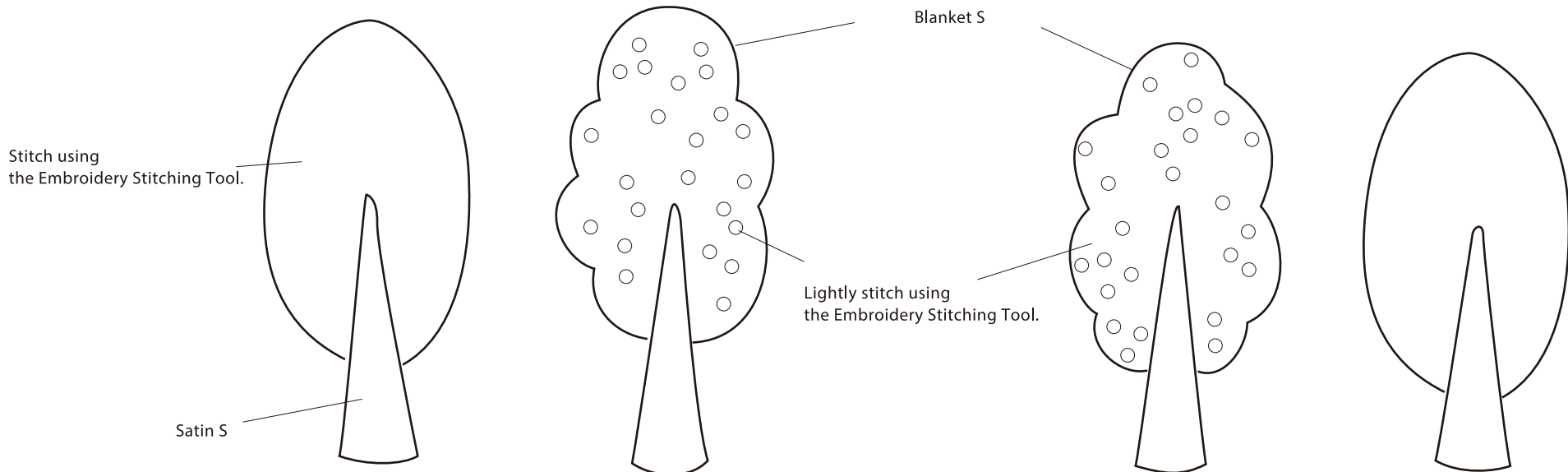

Green Tree

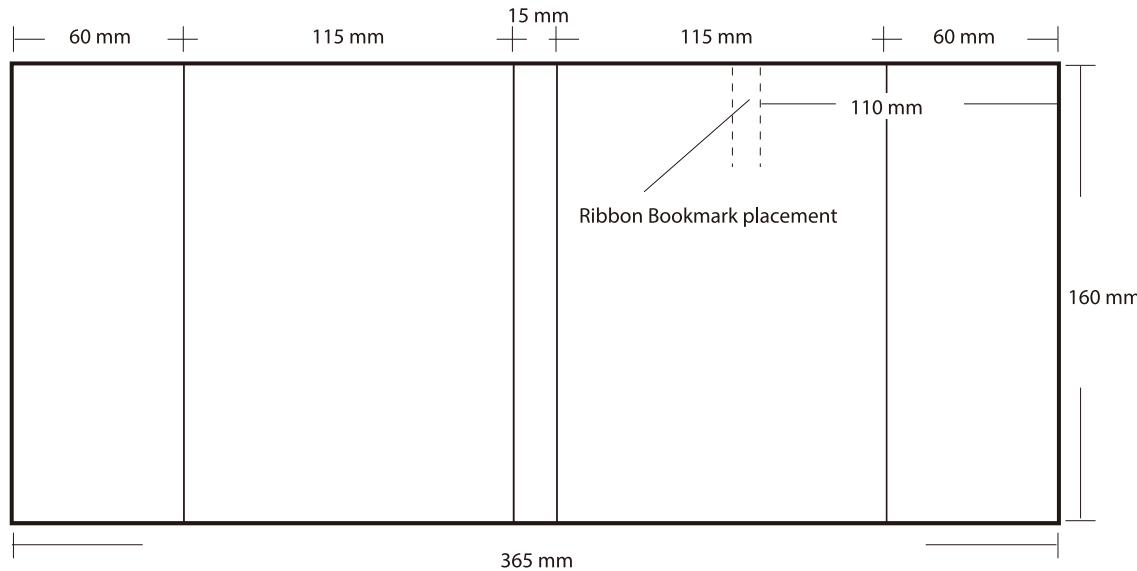
1. Copy the design onto the cloth.
2. Lightly trace the flower using an Erasable Marker onto the back of the cloth.
3. Embroider with a Tapestry Needle.
 - For the tree trunk, make it shell pink in color, using a leveled satin stitch.
 - Make the outline of the leaves using bluegreen.
4. Start stitching, using the Embroidery Stitching Tool. Set the scale to 0, and use the blue green thread.
5. Lightly coat stitched points with glue to prevent fraying.
6. Allow it to dry before using.

Book Cover Measurements (Pocket Paperback size)

*This is the size for the book 15 cm height. Please adjust the size for your book.



1. Non-adjustable Type

(Only suits books which fall within the measurements shown)

1-1.

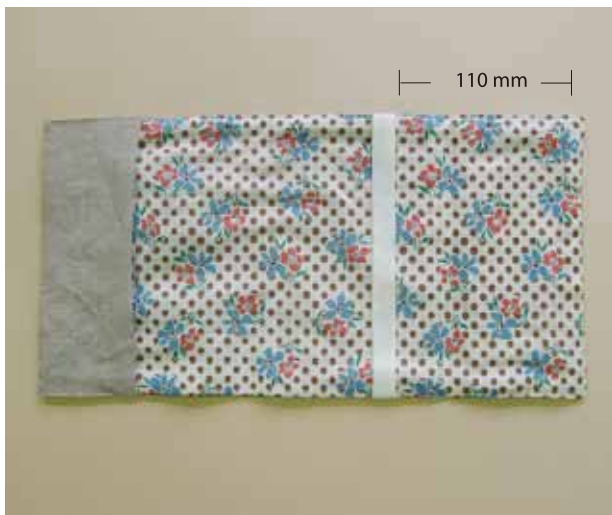
Add a 1 cm seam allowance to the book cover measurement of 365 x 160 mm to make it 385 x 180 mm and cut the embroidered front and back cloth.

1-2.

Turn the materials inside out (with right-side facing right-side). Sew a 1 cm seam on a sewing machine, leaving a slight opening to turn back later.

1-3.

Turn the cloth right side round and iron. Fold 60 mm in from both sides, and sew top and bottom on the sewing machine.



2. Adjustable Type (Book size dependant)

2-1.

Add a 1 cm seam allowance to the book cover measurement of 365 x 160 mm to make it 385 x 180 mm and cut the embroidered front and back cloth.

2-2.

Turn the materials inside out (with right-side facing right-side). Place a 1 cm wide ribbon between the two cloths in the position of the dotted line, Sew a 1 cm seam around the edge on a sewing machine, leaving a slight opening to turn back later.

2-3.

Turn the cloth right side round and iron. Fold 60 mm in from the left side only, and sew top and bottom on the sewing machine.
