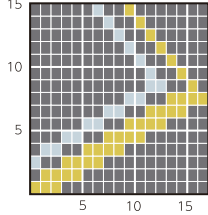


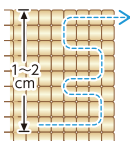
Earring Diagram



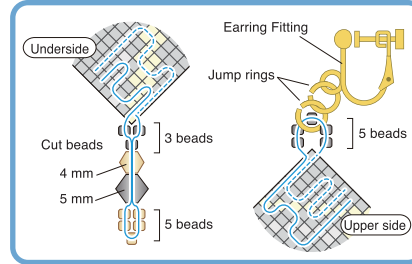
★ Zigzag

When decorating the material, start by passing a new thread through in a zigzag pattern.

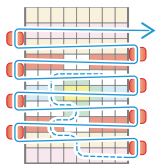
Pierce the needle initially 1-2 cm from the edge of the piece. Continue in a zigzag pattern, making sure to go through 2-3 weft rows. Exit in a similar way to the initial insertion.



\* Try not to pass through the same area more than once.

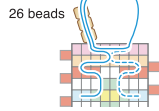


How to make the picot

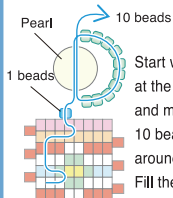


Making the loop

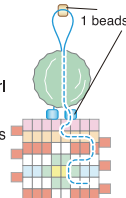
Pass through 3 times to make the loop.



Making the ball

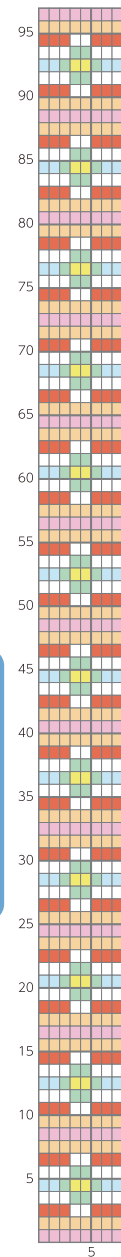


Start with one bottom bead at the foot, follow with a pearl and more add beads. Wrap 10 beads around 4 or 5 times around the pearl. Fill the gap with 6-9 beads.

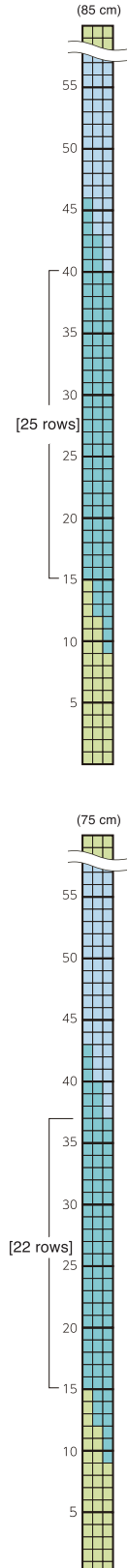


When the gap is filled, pass the top end of the thread through a bead, and then pass it back through the hole in the pearl. Pull the thread out from the bottom and pass through another bead at the foot, beside the starting bead.

Bracelet Diagram



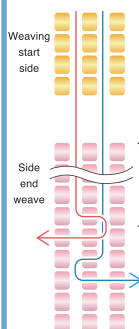
Necklace Diagram



Closing off \* Bead colors have been changed to make the chart easier to read)

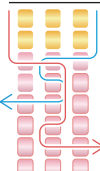
After completing the Center thread, finish the threads at both edges.

1. Center thread



Bring together both ends of the necklace. Pass the thread from one end through the center of 8-10 rows of beads on the other. Take the thread out the edge and cut the thread. Repeat with the other end and fasten the thread.

2. Threads at both edges



As in the image, pass the thread through the center of the beads. Take the thread out the edge and cut the thread. Repeat with the other end and fasten the thread.
